



Educate yourself on potentially negative interactions of over-the-counter drugs, prescription medications, and recreational drugs before you mix them with alcohol or other drugs.

Some medications when taken with alcohol can intensify the depressive effects of alcohol.

Vicodin[®], Percocet[®], Xanax[®], Ativan[®], or Valium[®] + Alcohol =

- Drowsiness, dizziness
- Increased risk for overdose
- Slowed or difficulty breathing
- Impaired motor control
- Unusual behavior
- Memory problems⁵

Other medications can mask alcohol's effects which makes alcohol poisoning more likely.

Adderall[®], Ritalin[®], and Dexedrine[®] + Alcohol =

- Dizziness, drowsiness
- Impaired concentration
- Liver damage⁵
- Possible increased risk for heart problems

Timing is Key: Alcohol and prescription medications can interact harmfully even if they are not taken at the same time.
